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Semi-annual financial results for FY2025

1. Consolidated Financial results Summary



- Net sales were 10,493 million yen (up 24.8% YoY), mainly due to increase in net sales to China and Japan.
- Operating profit was 386 million yen (up 565 million yen YoY), due to a decrease in selling, general and administrative expenses.

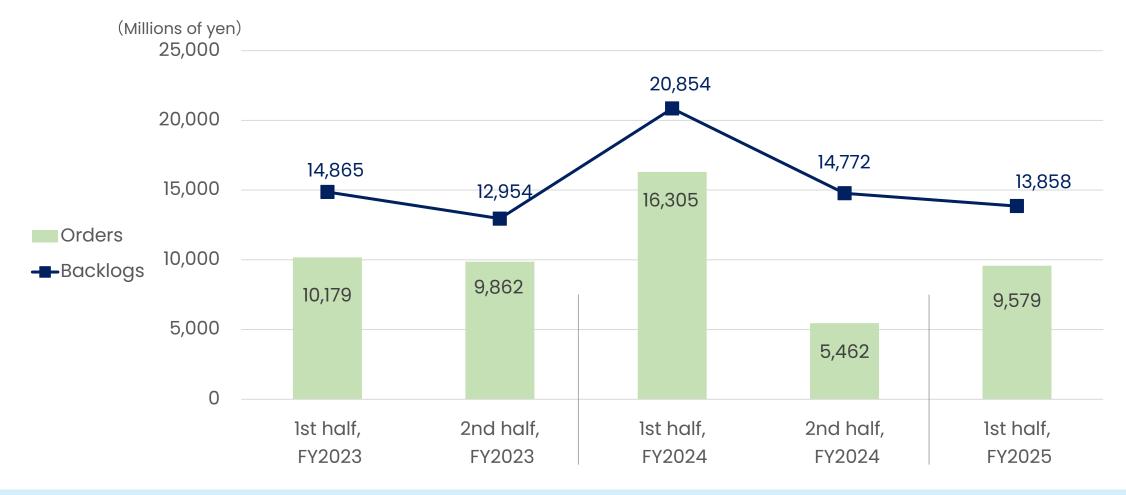

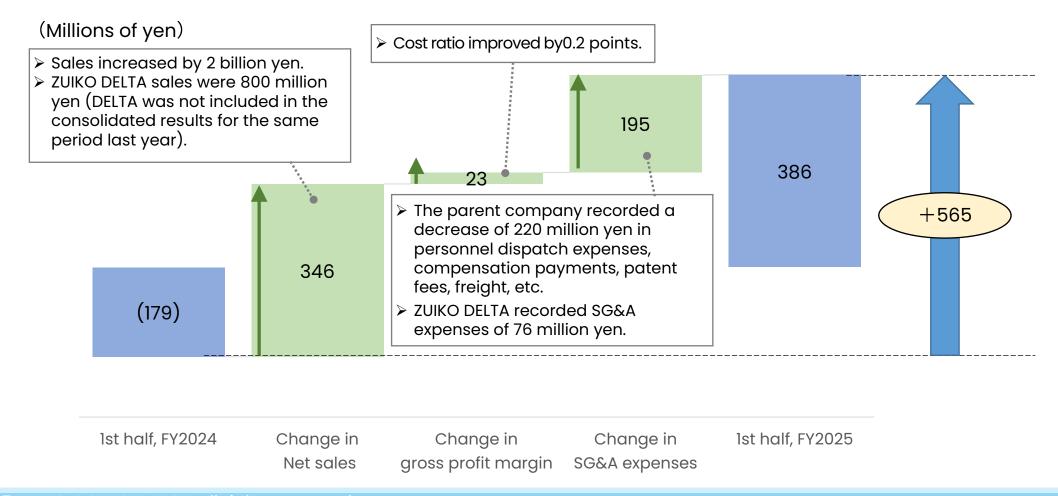

6. Fluctuation of operating profit compared to FY2024



- Due to increased sales, operating profit increased by 565 million yen compared to the same period last year to 386 million yen.
- SG&A expenses decreased overall due to cost reductions at the parent company that more than offset the increase in expenses resulting from the new consolidation of ZUIKO DELTA.

9. Finalization of the provisional accounting treatment for acquisition of ZUIKO DELTA



The purchase price allocation for ZUIKO DELTA, which was included in the consolidation in the second quarter of the previous year, has been finalized, and the amount of "goodwill" at the time of the consolidation has decreased from 270 million yen to 69 million yen.

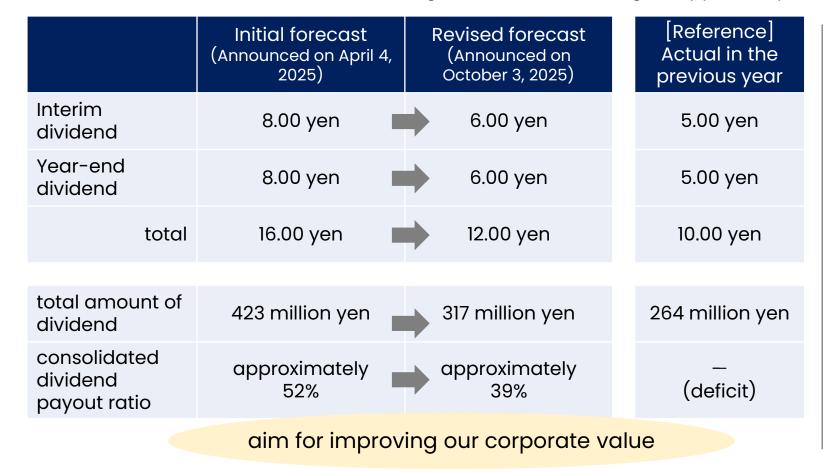

2. Revision of dividend forecast in this year

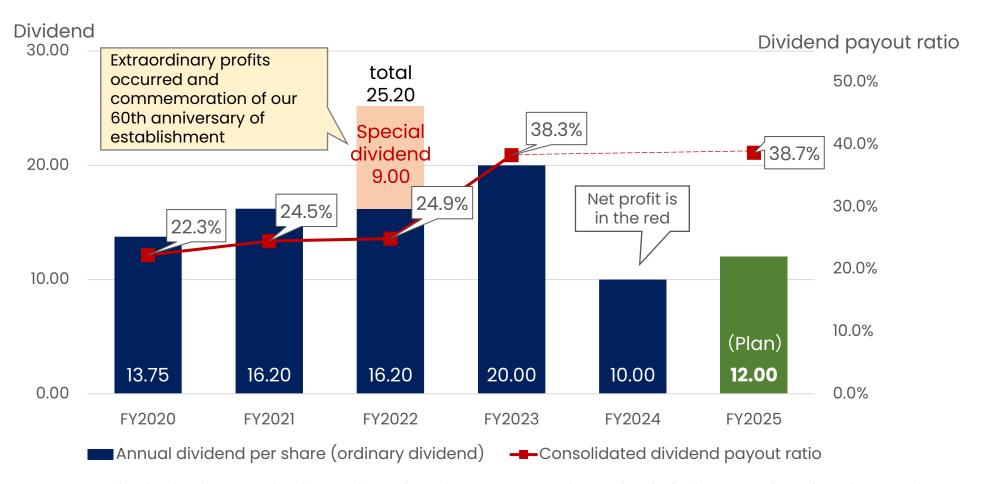

Note: The dividend amount has been adjusted to take into account the stock split (1 share → 4 shares) implemented in August 2020.



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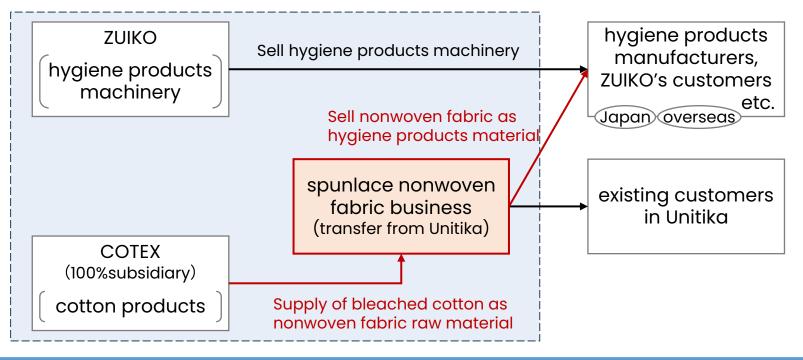

Acquisition of the spunlace nonwoven fabric business (will be executed in December 2025)

- We concluded an agreement on September 2025, to acquire the spunlace nonwoven fabric business operated by Unitika Ltd..
- We will enter the business of manufacturing and selling spunlace nonwoven fabrics made from cotton, in addition to manufacturing the cotton products in COTEX, our subsidiary.
 - ⇒We will promote cotton spunlace nonwoven fabric as a material for hygiene products to hygiene products manufacturers.


■ Establishment of a new subsidiary to expand sales of wound care products in China

- "Plus moist" series, sold by ZUIKO MEDICAL CORPORATION, has achieved high functionality through its unique technology, as the result of extensive research into controlling the wound exudate to be the most important factor in wound treatment.
- We will grow the wound care products business in China.

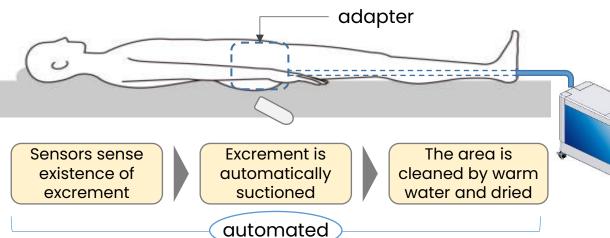

- We have decided to make additional investment in PROGA ZUIKO CORPORATION ("PROGA ZUIKO"), our affiliated company which is also the intended buyer of the automated manufacturing machinery for protective gowns.
- Since announcing its entry into this business in October 2024, we have proceeded with the design and development of the machinery in close cooperation with PROGA ZUIKO
 - ⇒Now that the design and development of automated protective gown manufacturing machinery has reached a certain milestone, PROGA ZUIKO plans to raise capital from multiple investors.
 - ⇒We undertake part of this capital increase in PROGA ZUIKO.
- Launch of this machinery is scheduled in October 2026.
